Hearing God's promise of forgiveness

We can come into God's presence without fear trusting in what Jesus has achieved for all who trust in Him and express that trust by asking for forgiveness. We remind each other of the promise of God -

'If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.'

Lord God, we have sinned against You; we have done evil in Your sight. We are sorry and repent. Have mercy on us according to Your love. Wash away our wrongdoing and cleanse us from our sin. Renew a right spirit within us and restore us to the joy of your salvation, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Hear the promise of Jesus -'Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

¹ The prophecy that Habakkuk the prophet received.

² How long, LORD, must I call for help, but you do not listen? Or cry out to you, 'Violence!' but you do not save? ³ Why do you make me look at injustice? Why do you tolerate wrongdoing? Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife, and conflict abounds. ⁴ Therefore the law is paralysed, and justice never prevails. The wicked hem in the righteous, so that justice is perverted.

⁵ 'Look at the nations and watch – and be utterly amazed. For I am going to do something in your days that you would not believe, even if you were told.

⁶ I am raising up the Babylonians, that ruthless and impetuous people, who sweep across the whole earth to seize dwellings not their own. ⁷ They are a feared and dreaded people; they are a law to themselves and promote their own honour. ⁸ Their horses are swifter than leopards, fiercer than wolves at dusk. Their cavalry gallops headlong; their horsemen come from afar. They fly like an eagle swooping to devour; ⁹they all come intent on violence. Their hordes advance like a desert wind and gather prisoners like sand.

¹⁰ They mock kings and scoff at rulers. They laugh at all fortified cities; by building earthen ramps they capture them. ¹¹ Then they sweep past like the wind and go on – guilty people, whose own strength is their god.'
